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## TITLE 1 SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

The HOPE for Hyndman Charter School and the parents of students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act agree that this compact outlines how the parents, school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children meet or exceed Pennsylvania's high standards. ### SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES

All teachers and staff will:

- have high expectations for students and be committed to continuous growth for the teacher, staff, and the school.
- help students resolve conflicts in positive, nonviolent ways.
- coordinate efforts with other staff to support the success of each child.
- create a caring, inclusive, stimulating, and safe school/classroom setting.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
  - Conferences will be held once a year in the fall. A letter will be sent home with your child with more information about the conferences.
- **3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.** Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
  - Grade reports mailed to parents/guardians at the end of each 9 week period.
  - Progress reports mailed to parents/guardians at the end of each 9 week period.
  - iReady/DIBELS/CDT reports mailed to parents 3 times a year: beginning of 1<sup>st</sup> marking period, end of 2<sup>nd</sup> marking period, and end of 4<sup>th</sup> marking period.
    - -iReady (grades 1-8), DIBELS (grades K-5), CDT (grades 9-12)
  - PowerSchool maintained on a regular basis, providing parents with access to student's assignments, attendance, and grading information.

- **4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
  - Parents may email or call teacher at any time. A staff contact list is available on our website.
- 5. Communicate and work with families to support students' learning.
- 6. Hold an annual meeting in the beginning of the school year to inform parents of the school's participation in the Title 1, Part A programs, and to explain the Title 1, Part A requirements, and the right of parents to be involved in the Title 1, Part A programs.
